## 1 THE PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT

This Action Plan has been prepared by Ashton Keynes Parish Council. Its purpose is to advise the Parishioners of Ashton Keynes of the steps that they should take in the event of a local civil emergency.

The sort of emergencies that might arise could include:

- flooding
- severe weather
- disruption or loss of utilities
- accidents on industrial sites
- chemical spillages
- transport incidents
- major fires
- health epidemics
- terrorist attacks
- unexploded weapons

No plan can cover all exigencies but this document provides a list of resources and contact details for those local agencies that might be able to provide assistance alongside the professional emergency services. A list of these agencies is shown in Annex A.

## 2 WHAT YOU SHOULD DO IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY SITUATION

When disaster strikes the Emergency Services need clear and concise information as soon as possible. Should you be the first to arrive at the scene of an incident, do not, in the first instance, attempt to help.

### **QUICKLY ASSESS THE SITUATION AND THEN CALL 999 IMMEDIATELY TO SUMMON THE EMERGENCY SERVICES.**

If you don't have immediate access to a telephone or mobile phone, call on a nearby property or flag down a passing vehicle and ask them to pass a message to the emergency services.

Then, without endangering your own safety, try and obtain the following additional information to assist the emergency services when they arrive:

- **Casualties.** Location, number and type of injuries.
- **Fire.** What is on fire or is a fire imminent? Are there hazardous items nearby - fuel, paint, gas bottles, explosives?

- **Vehicles.** Is a Hazard Warning Panel marking displayed on any vehicle, e.g. a tanker?
- **Buildings.** Are they in danger of collapse? Are people still inside?
- **Access to the Incident.** Is it clear for vehicles? Are there alternative routes?
- **Water.** Are there alternative supplies for hydrants? Rivers, lakes, ponds, swimming pools, farm tankers?

Finally, when satisfied the above information has been gathered, and again without endangering your own safety, assist with controlling traffic and people, casualties, fire-fighting and rescue until the emergency services arrive.

### 3 WHAT YOU SHOULD DO IN THE EVENT OF A NON-EMERGENCY SITUATION

In a non-emergency situation, contact the Wiltshire Emergency Planning Unit if necessary for information or advice:

## **5 WARNING & INFORMING THE COMMUNITY: “GO IN, STAY IN, TUNE IN”**

The Police may request local radio stations to issue warning and advice messages. The local frequencies that cover the county of Wiltshire are shown in Annex C.

## **6 WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF CHEMICAL, RADIATION ACCIDENTS, TOXIC FUMES OR SMOKE**

- Stay indoors, shut all doors and windows and tune to your local radio station.
- Switch off air conditioning or fans.
- If you are outside, go into the nearest building or shop.
- Listen to loudspeaker and radio announcements and be ready to move if the area is evacuated.

## **7 WHAT TO DO IF A SEVERE STORM IS THREATENED**

- Tie down loose items outside that cannot be brought in.
- Stay indoors - preferably downstairs – and keep pets in.
- Clear windowsills and close curtains to protect against flying glass.
- If gas, electricity or water is cut off, tell the relevant service.
- As soon as it is safe, rope off or protect damaged areas to prevent injury from falling masonry, broken glass or electric cables.

## COMMUNITY EMERGENCY VOLUNTEERS

Central Government (The Office of the Deputy Prime Minister in 2003) decided that Community Emergency Volunteers (CEV) should be sought who would be a member of the local community who can act as an emergency co-ordinator in the event of a major incident in their area.

Community Emergency Volunteers make themselves available to the Parish Council to:

- Act as a point of contact for day-to-day emergency situations.
- Provide a point of contact for the Environment Agency.
- Assist in the production, review, updating and implementation of the Parish Initial Action Plan for Civil Emergencies.
- Provide advice on any emergency matters that might not fall within the remit of the Police, Fire or Ambulance services.
- Be a channel of information and advice on such matters to members of the community.
- Maintain contact with the Wiltshire County Council Emergency Planning Unit.
- Provide a focal point in Ashton Keynes for any expansion in volunteer numbers arising from a peacetime or wartime emergency.

**A CEV has no authority unless they are “activated” by the Wiltshire County Council Emergency Planning Unit.**

Even then, they do not assume the authority of the Emergency Services and cannot close roads or ask any individual to do anything that may put themselves or others in danger.

They are insured by Wiltshire County Council only when they have been contacted and asked to act on its behalf. They must log the time of the initial contact and all subsequent actions.

## FLOOD ADVICE

### BEFORE A FLOOD

- Get advice from:
  - **Floodline** on **0345 988 1188**
  - **Website** at <https://flood-warning-information.service.gov.uk/warnings>
  - **Local radio**
- Prepare an emergency pack containing a torch and radio with batteries, warm waterproof clothing, prescription medication, bottled water, non-perishable food and mobile phone.
- Protect doorways, low level windows and air bricks with plywood or metal sheets, sand bags/Gel Sacs or rubbish bags filled with earth. Use silicon sealant to help make doors and windows more water resistant.
- Put plugs into sinks and baths and weigh them down; disconnect the washing machine and dishwasher outlets.
- Move as much as you can upstairs: important documents, irreplaceable family mementos and photographs/videos, expensive items and furniture.
- Make sure pets are safe.
- Store chemicals like paint, cleaning products and pesticides high up.
- Put electrical equipment and as much heavy furniture as possible upstairs or if you can't do this weigh down furniture with something heavy.
- Move outdoor items and cars to higher ground.
- Weigh down manhole covers with something heavy.
- Turn off gas, electricity and water **before** floodwater enters your home.

### WHEN THE FLOOD HITS

- Move upstairs but ensure there is a means of escape.
- Continue to listen to local radio for advice.
- Stay safe and comply with the Emergency Services' advice.
- Don't try to walk or drive through floodwater – it could be contaminated or contain hazards you can't see.
- Don't walk on river banks or bridges – they could collapse.

### AND AFTERWARDS

- Contact your insurance company as soon as possible.
- Take photos or video footage of the damage.
- Mark the water levels for reference.
- Wear protective clothing when clearing up.
- Remove mud and disinfect with hot soapy water and detergent.
- Dispose of soft furnishings, food and clothes, which have been in contact with flood water
